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# NEW SCIENCE LAB AT JA-HC CREATES BUBBLY REACTION

On Wednesday, November 8, JA-HC dedicated the Science Lab, a state-of-the-art learning environment that embodies the school's commitment to fostering innovation and experiential learning in the classroom.

It's complete with safety features including an eyewash station, a prep room, and sinks. There's also built-in storage areas for equipment, tools and materials with locking drawers for chemical storage.

There are future plans for a station for live animals, specifically an area to hatch and grow chickens. This will be a great opportunity for all classes to be involved in a long-term project that would serve as a focal point for several STEMScope units (Energy Flow, Ecosystems, etc). Some of the counter space will be dedicated to fish tanks, birdcages or lizard enclosures. It will also be a priority to get each student a lab coat for the next school year.

Principal Reid shares, "Having a new fully functioning lab gives our scholars the tools needed to not only learn science at a high level, but to see themselves as scientists. Dr. Seay, our 7th and 8th Science teacher and former Yale researcher, has big plans to make sure that our scholars know their place in the world of Science. He is creating an active learning center that provides hands on experiments and learning for all scholars.

## HONORING THE PAST, PREPARING THE FUTURE

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As we prepare for the future, the Academy has strategically focused on 5 areas for improving our school community. Those areas include 1). Developing our curriculum, 2). Human Resources, 3). Facilities

Management, 4). Stakeholder Engagement, and 5).

Collaboration and partnering with the Connecticut State Department of Education. In addition to the strategic focus, our District Improvement Plan goals are grounded in our Strategic Roadmap and District Improvement goals, that ensure scholars master grade level standards in core content classes and the develop their social, emotional, communication, and critical thinking skills. As a result of these priorities, I am confident that we will prepare them for the future.

At the onset of this school year, the Academy applied for and received funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER) and American Rescue Plan (ARP) to assist in our efforts to continue to educate our scholars. Our focus has been to improve and utilize these resources to provide education in a safe and secure environment while also identifying the correct staffing, instructional materials, and professional development necessary to do so. Much of our available resources has been spent on improving our technology through Chromebook upgrades and technology platforms, hiring specialized staff, scholar enrichment programming, family community connections, maintaining safe and healthy schools, and support for addressing social and emotional learning.

Every month, we host a zoom meeting with our Executive Director Dr. Monroe, so our parents get a chance to connect with him, ask questions, and learn about new initiatives and programs available to our scholars. This event has been crucial in our reopening this fall and we look forward to continuing the forum on Zoom.



### JAH-SMaRT STEMS it up!

Jumoke Academy is pleased to announce that it has been selected as an Amazon Future Engineer (AFE) school - a partnership between Amazon and Project STEM to improve access to computer science education in communities currently underrepresented in the technology field.

According to the Bureau of Labor statistics, by 2020 there will be 1.4 million computer science related jobs available and only 400,000 computer science graduates with the skills to apply for those jobs.

Many students eager to fill that gap and obtain a high paying job in technology do not have access to computer science in their middle and high schools. Often schools want to offer these courses to their students but do not have access to curriculum and/or teacher support materials.



Amazon and Project STEM are partnering to address this gap by sponsoring teachers and administrators who demonstrate this need and are committed to bringing computer science to their school with access to content such as: CS Explorations 1: Fundamentals in Scratch, Computer Science Fundamentals, AP Computer Science Principles, or AP Computer Science A courses. This content also includes fully sequenced and paced digital curriculum for students,
