**Connecticut Charter Schools** on National **Education Panel**

#### Jumoke Academy High School Transition Series: How Jumoke Is Working For Your 8th Grade Scholar

Jumoke Academy continues its commitment to matriculating 8th-grade scholars through the success of the Jumoke Academy High School Transition program. Each year, rising 8th-grade scholars are given a choice as to which high school they will attend. To support scholars and their families with this instrumental decision, Jumoke Academy offers an extensive high school transition program that introduces all available options to those attending the Academy. The program offers experiential on and off-campus opportunities where scholars can learn about and participate in majors and themes offered by various schools.

Jumoke Academy believes in providing opportunities to its scholars and, because of this, continues to partner with various private and independent high schools. The Academy offers scholars in-person, virtual, and off-campus opportunities with private schools to inform families' decisions when choosing a high school. Each year, scholars and families are met with individually, and supported with the complex private school applications.

During this time, scholars are scheduled with the assistance of Jumoke, for their private school interviews, and parents are supported with navigating financial aid paperwork. Jumoke assumes the responsibility of the entire application process as a commitment to the families and community we serve.

The High School Transition program does not stop at private schools. It is the introduction and experiential opportunities of Agriscience schools that pave the way for additional opportunities Jumoke scholars are awarded through this program. Agriscience high schools push into science classes and work with 8th-grade scholars yearly.

Jumoke again, assumes the responsibility for supporting scholars during the application and interview process associated with Connecticut Agriscience. During the second week of December, Jumoke 8th grade scholars will work with Bloomfield Agriscience as they are pushing into Science classes to show scholars the programming offered at Bloomfield High School Agriscience.



As a Hartford or Greater Hartford resident, the RSCO lottery is one of the most popular options. Jumoke Academy meets with families and scholars to ensure each scholar is enrolled in the lottery yearly, and parents are supported with technology to assist in this effort. Home visits to complete applications take place to meet the needs of families.

The success of Jumoke Academy and its High School Transition initiative is demonstrated by the 100% placement of scholars in high schools. Each year, all scholars will be registered and ready to begin their next chapter due to the yearlong preparation that takes place. Currently, the most popular schools sought after by scholars and families are Loomis Chaffee, Rosemary Choate, Kingswood Oxford, Suffield Academy, Ethel Walker, Glastonbury Agriscience, Bloomfield Agriscience, CREC Magnet, and Achievement First Hartford High School. These abovelisted schools continue to partner with the Academy and actively support scholars' recruitment efforts.

**Application Process:** December 3rd the lottery opens for all of the Technical, CREC, and Open Choice High Schools. Families will be contacted prior to this date to schedule personalized meetings.

**January 15th** is the deadline for the private school and financial aid applications to be submitted.


